Pathways to Maturity - Spiritual Formation

As many of you know, I gave my life to Christ early in my sophomore year of college. I had been attending the InterVarsity prayer time so I could join them for breakfast, but I was terrified to pray. They did get me reading the Gospel of John, which was instrumental to my decision to follow Jesus, but I really had no idea what Bible study, devotions, quiet times, or any other spiritual disciplines were supposed to look like or accomplish.

InterVarsity soon sent me on a weekend retreat where I was coached and then sent on a 3-hour silent retreat with just a Bible. That was life changing. Later that day we began an inductive Bible study on the Gospel of Mark. That, too, was life changing stuff.

I've now spent years learning about and practicing different spiritual disciplines.

Some of you are checking out right now... you're thinking "that's just for pastors." THINK AGAIN. It is for you, and every other believer... stick with me.

Last month I explained... "I am thrilled to see the <u>Alliance organize</u> <u>pathways</u> toward ordination. I get it, most of you have no desire to be ordained, but you should have a desire to be mature, and the pathways to pastoral ordination lays out the <u>foundational competencies</u> for ministry leadership. In the

coming months, I hope to walk through the major areas of spiritual maturity outlined by the Alliance."

Spiritual formation is the first category of competencies. The FIRST! While they are all important, being formed by the Spirit through the Word of God and prayer is the foundation of a Christian life and certainly essential for any pastor. Elders, take note, this is for you. Deacons, Sunday school teachers, youth coaches, this is for you!

Spiritual formation is simply the idea that you, as a believer, are to be formed, molded, grown, matured, and transformed to be more and more like Jesus. This happens as we yield ourselves to the work of the Spirit and the Word in our lives.

The Alliance Ordination Team has agreed the following three competencies are essential for pastors...

#1 Spiritual Disciplines: Practices a range of personal spiritual disciplines routinely.

#2 Christian Friendships: Maintains friendships with Christians who are available for emotional support, counsel, and general enjoyment.

#3 Rest/Sabbath: Observes the sabbath and other rhythms of rest.

Prayer: Petition/Intercession
Meditation with the Scriptures
Study of the Scriptures
Worship with other believers
Fellowship with other believers
Confession (of sins to another)
Fasting
Feasting
Hospitality

I shared a few weeks ago, a quote from Gladys Kastein's handwritten devotional. She certainly understood the call of the Christian to practice the spiritual discipline of prayer...

"Why Pray? Prayer is the provision he has given us. He commanded us to pray. Pray without ceasing (1 Thessalonians 5:17). He delights in our fellowship. The prayer of the upright is his delight (Prov. 15:8). Our prayers glorify God... (John 14:13) Prayer brings results (James 5:17-18). When we pray we follow Christ's example. (Mark 1:35) Prayer gives us a peaceful heart and an unworried mind. (Phil. 4:6-7) Prayer brings God into focus in our lives. It shows our dependence upon him and trust in him to work out the concerns of our lives in accordance

with his will."

I hope you will join me in intentionally pursuing our mission to "know Jesus..." I pray, we, as a church, will pay greater attention to our soul, mind, and heart so that we truly reflect Jesus to the world. Pick a discipline and start growing it.

OPTIONS FOR SPIRITUAL FORMATION:

There are several great books on Spiritual disciplines. I've enjoyed John Ortberg's The Life You've Always Wanted, Richard J. Foster's <u>Celebration of Discipline</u>, and Dallas Willard's The Spirit of the Disciplines. I recommend the following resources too.

A Praying Life: Connecting with God in a Distracting World; by Paul E. Miller, David Powlison. (This is an inspiring book that will help you make time for prayer. I just bought his next book "A Praying Church," but have not started it yet.)

Alto Staffing Progress:

The consultant spent a couple days with us in July and is helping us fine tune a job description. The Executive Team hopes to have this in the hands of the Consistory very soon for their review. From there, Slingshot will begin the search and be presenting candidates in the coming months.

Our Network:

On July 26, Kevin, three elders, and others from the Wisconsin Cluster joined a meeting to explore developing the Upper Mississippi Valley Network. Churches in Illinois and Eastern Iowa have joined the Dakota Network with the same hope we had to start a new network in our area.

The Dakota Network is supportive of this new network. At the same time, they realize they are no longer defined by the "Dakota" geography and will vote to change their name to Midwest Network on Aug. 1. Here's their latest update...

Facts & Figures (as of 6/30/23):

- The Network is made up of 80 member churches representing 8 former RCA Classes: Dakota, West Sioux, East Sioux, Illinois, Pleasant Prairie, Minnesota, Wisconsin and Central Iowa.
- Six more churches have been invited from Iowa & Wisconsin. More continue to enter the pipeline to be released later this year and have been in contact, too.
- Churches have joined the Network from 4 distinct waves out of the RCA:
 - 37 churches were released Fall '21 from 3 Classes (Dakota, Minnesota, Illinois)
 - 5 more were released Spring '22 from 2 Classes (Dakota, East Sioux)
 - 30 more were released Fall '22 from 6 Classes (Central Iowa, Illinois, Wisconsin [Technically, we were released in 2021 and

- joined Dakota in 2022], Pleasant Prairie, West Sioux, Northern Michigan, & Minnesota)
- 8 more were released Spring '23 from 3 Classes (Minnesota, East Sioux, Pleasant Prairie)
- At least 3 more churches are in the pipeline for release this Fall.
- Conversations are underway to create new clusters in the eastern part of our geography who will eventually become a new Upper Mississippi Valley Network (UMVN)
- \$73k cash on hand
- 59 churches have provided Partnership Offerings
- 5 clusters are meeting regularly, 2 more have had initial meetings, and one other is in development
- UMVN churches have begun to build a cash reserve for eventual launch of their new Network.

The Alliance Board has also share a recent update...

Alliance Governing Board Updates to the Churches July 25, 2023

Last month I mentioned that two members of the Alliance Governing Board had completed their terms. We have two new members to the board to announce. Pastor Craig Gilbert, lead pastor of Haven Reformed Church of Kalamazoo, MI will represent The Michigan Catalyst Network, and Pastor Ron Fischer, Director of Operations and Pastor of Outreach and Care, of Christ's Family Church in Davenport, IA will be a board member at large, and the treasurer of the Governing Board. We are pleased to have them joining us on the board!

At this point in time the Alliance Website notes 159 churches fully into the Alliance. Many more are having conversations with Alliance staff or members in regard to that possibility. The Dakota Network has 80 congregations, with additional ones coming after the fall classes meetings. One of our concerns as a network is that we have thirteen congregations who are at some stage of searching for their next pastor. A couple of those thirteen are to the point of having individuals who are candidating this coming weekend. Three additional congregations are waiting to install their new pastors. There is an additional two

congregations who presently have interim pastors. Continue to pray for God to raise up out of the pews leaders for Christ's Church! Pray for the congregations that are vacant and who are in the process of discerning God's leading for a pastor. Pray for the leadership of regions where there are more vacancies than installed pastors!

Many individuals continue to be processed in regard to evaluating their level of preparation through the credentialing pathways for leadership in ministry. That too is encouraging.

The Alliance Gathering is only two weeks away. Two hundred and twenty people have registered to attend. We are looking forward to times of worship, equipping, learning and fellowshipping. Many are coming from the Dakota Network.

We have talked for months about the interest in birthing a new network out of the Dakota Network, and that work continues to move ahead. Congregations in NE/NC Iowa, SE Iowa, Western Illinois, and Wisconsin are looking into such a possibility. Stay tuned!

Finances for the Dakota Network remain stable and encouraging. For the Alliance on the national level, God continues to provide timely gifts. Many of the churches in the Alliance are just now completing their RCA financial commitment, and are now beginning to share their covenant gifts with the Alliance. We are grateful for that.

Work has begun for the planning of the fall Dakota Network Meeting. It is Nov. 10 and 11. American Ref. Church of Worthington MN has agreed to host us. This location is a few miles farther east for our churches in that direction, but not too many additional miles for our churches in the west. More information will be coming on this annual meeting.

I hope you are enjoying life this summer and that ministry is bringing glory to Christ our Lord!
