## Raising Kids in an Anti-Christian World

Anti-Christian rhetoric is increasingly insulting and attacking believers.

The Olympic opening ceremony was the latest attack with its repulsive amoral messaging... a threesome love-affair, rampant promotion of transgenderism, and the mocking of the Lord's Supper. (The argument that it was about Greek gods is lame; the message was clear. The response of the Paris 2024 spokesperson was, at best, ignorant about Christianity and certainly not promoting tolerance.

Throughout our nation, students are being forced to submit to pronoun and bathroom policies<sup>[3]</sup>, teachers are being forced to remain silent with parents when their children struggle with their gender<sup>[4]</sup>, and school boards are stuck between receiving government funds and their constituents.<sup>[5]</sup>

Disney and other producers are doing their best to push liberal ideology and DEI in shows like "The Proud Family: Louder and Prouder", "Strange World", "Lightyear", "The Owl House", "My Little Pony: Friendship is Magic", "Chip and Potato", "Generation Drag", and "Steven Universe". Then we have the stories of parents having their child taken from them or not being allowed to foster children, because they refuse to help children "transition."

As well, to answer the above question, I'd love to have an in-depth look at and evaluation of school options, but that was not my intention for this article. Let me just say, we do need families to be a light as they go into public schools, we do need families to be a light as they go into private schools, and we do need families to be a light as they learn at home. I urge you to be supportive of every family as they navigate what is best.

My concern now is simply to give you one simple strategy for helping your kids be a light in this world.

Bless your kids!

No, I do not mean materially. The cool clothes, the latest phone, and the sweetest car will not get the results you want.

I implore you to pray a blessing over your kids!

"I'm not good at praying." "That would be awkward." "That's good for you, pastor, but that's not me."

Paul has already responded to our fears..."Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God." (Philippians 4:6)

When Jesus left his disciples, he blessed them saying..."Peace be with you." (John 14:27; 20:19,21,26)

Paul included near the end of <u>every</u> letter a blessing on the believers. The most simplistic was, "Grace be with you." (Colossians 4:18).

You can expand on these, but this is a priceless, easy way to start spiritually guarding and guiding your kids!

#### These simple blessings do several things...

- 1. They assure your child that you care about them.
- 2. They empower your child to walk with peace and grace among wolves.
- 3. They call upon our mighty God to guard and guide your child.

Personally, I expand Aaron's blessing in Numbers 6:24-26...

"The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make his face shine on you and be gracious to you; the Lord turn his face toward you and give you peace." ... joy, rest... wisdom to know what is right and the courage to do what is right.

As you start simple, you will get more and more comfortable and confident in praying more specifically for your child's challenges. If they are out of the home, as we are now experiencing,

you can keep praying from a distance, but I'm thinking I need to restart this practice when I visit.

This really is central to what your child needs every day as they head into the world.

**PRAYER:** Make me a blessing to my children, that they will walk in your ways, having grace, peace and joy in their hearts. Stir me to pray boldly over them that they are assured of my love, empowered by your peace and grace, and guarded and guided by your Spirit. AMEN.


