The Area of Spiritual Development We Most Neglect: Church History (Part 7 of Pathways to Maturity)

I really can't believe I'm writing an article on this topic. History was never a topic I enjoyed. In high school, history classes were incredibly boring to me. It was overwhelming and seemed irrelevant. In college, the massive



books to read for my western civilization class did not change my perspective. I dreaded memorizing dates and places. It was just terribly difficult to see why any of it mattered to me.

No doubt, many of you are in the same boat and simply did the minimum to pass those history classes.

The Church across America has done little to inspire any appreciation for history. Pastors occasionally throw in an illustration



from the past, but current stories get the limelight. If we did offer a Sunday school class on church history, I'm pretty sure there would just be three in the room: me, God and the wall. (I suppose you could count the trinity and all four walls to get us to 8.)

For me, a change in perspective happened when I came to Alto and picked up your 150th anniversary book. Reading the history of Alto, I found it more and more fascinating to see some of the struggles that the church went through. It was exciting to see the growth and expansion of the church and encouraging to see how the church navigated painful times and came out stronger. I've marked up those pages circling dates and major events.

Then, while on a long trip to Florida, Steph and I started to listen to a biography on Dietrich, Bonhoeffer. I'd heard of this man in college. Then I read his infamous book on discipleship called "The Cost of Discipleship" in seminary. But, I never really knew his story. Eric Mataxes' "Bonhoeffer: Pastor, Martyr, Prophet, Spy" was a captivating story of a pastor seeking to do what was right under the threats of the Nazi regime. I was inspired to live my faith all the more. I grew in appreciation of this pastor and learning about the past.

From there we have listened to books on Johnathan Edwards, George Muller, George Whitefield, John Wesley, Susanna Wesley, and Benjamin Franklin. These led me to watch documentaries on John Wycliffe, Norman Geisler,

William Wilberforce, Martin Luther, Charles Spurgeon, William Tyndall, and Saint Augustine. I am sure, there are many more it would be good for me to learn about.



Here's what I've found... When you look at the story of one person, history comes to life. Worry about dates, events, and locations later. Just know that beyond reading Scripture, entering the story of a saint may be the most encouraging thing you do this year.
