ARTICLES Keeping Focus

I had an eye appointment the other day, and, yep things are a bit blurry. They did all the regular tests and even high tech pictures of my eye. In the end, I'll have some new glasses with slightly changed lenses.

My physical vision will be clearer. That

was an easy fix.

We live in a very blurry world. Politically,



socially, racially, and spiritually our world is divided and distracted. Our news media and social media are filled with conflicting arguments over everything. Should kids play sports? Should they wear masks? Should the government close businesses? Should the federal government send troops into cities?

I can see some of you boiling over in

frustration. These issues and others have become very contentious as we want people to see our side is right. So often I want to play devil's advocate to push back on strong opinions, but isn't that really being an advocate for the devil?

Paul challenges Timothy...

"Don't have anything to do with foolish and stupid arguments, because you know they produce quarrels. And the Lord's servant must not be quarrelsome but must be kind to everyone, able to teach, not resentful." (2 Timothy 2:23-24 NIV)

I do believe it matters more how we interact on these issues than whether we "win" the debate. In most of these quarrels, our eyes become blurred, anger and hurt filter what we hear, and we respond by fighting or fleeing. Now, more than ever, we must be the Lord's servant and be kind to everyone.

The only way we can do that is through the work of the Holy Spirit in us. Again, Paul gives great direction to Timothy... "Until I get there, focus on reading the Scriptures to the church, encouraging the believers, and teaching them." (1 Timothy 4:13 NLT)

What might happen if we truly focused on, i.e. devoted ourselves to, these three things? Read. Encourage. Teach.

We are nudging you to read the minor prophets this summer, <u>watch the Bible</u> <u>Project videos</u> on each one, and then dig into the book with us.

In the Fall, we will give you another great opportunity to Read, Encourage, & Teach. We plan to use "Discipleship Essentials: A Guide to Building Your Life in Christ." We hope many of you will use the workbook in your private devotions, discuss it in discipleship groups, and be inspired by the correlating sermons in worship services. This is a significant step in our discipleship path, <u>Journey to 412</u>, toward intentionally growing to be like Christ.

It's tempting to think more COVID, political, or cultural information will clear up our vision, but don't count on it. Let's keep our eyes focused on the author and perfecter of our faith (Hebrews 12:2) as we read Scripture, encourage believers, and teach each other.

Last of the Last

By Roxy Schouten Perhaps many of us remember "last words" of a loved one before they passed. Maybe it was not a word but a squeeze of the hand or other acknowledgement of your presence. We relive those again and again for comfort and sometimes regrets.

Jesus' last words have been the theme of many a sermon and books written on the significance of those words. The Apostles Peter and Paul also had last words when they knew that their lives on earth were coming to an end.

Il Timothy is one such letter from Paul to his beloved "son" (not by blood but in spirit). Paul gives instruction and reminders how to continue teaching and leading. Paul also gives warnings about events that <u>will</u> happen in the "last days". In II Timothy 3:1 he warns "there will be terrible times in the last days". Unlike the English language, the Greek language has levels of meaning to words. The word "last" here means "last of the last". It's like describing the very last cookie in the cookie jar versus "the remaining few".

Paul goes on to describe what signs willsignal the "last of the last" in Verses 2-5. Not a pretty picture! Knowing this can

bring fear, dread and a feeling of helplessness. We seek for protection and strategies to displace this fear. Following are practical and helpful attitudes and activities to help us navigate through these "last of the last" days. (I cannot cite the source but when I came across this I wrote this in my Bible for future reference. I hope that they both challenge and comfort you as they have and continue to be for me.)

1. Remember Psalm 2

- God's <u>purpose</u> will prevail. The nations, organizations and people may conspire and plot but God laughs and scoffs at them because His purpose <u>will</u> prevail.

- 2. Cast your cares upon Jesus (1 Pet 5:7) – I once heard a message on this passage and she dramatically demonstrated it by pointing out this "casting" was not to be half-hearted nor with a string attached so that we could reel it back in. She took off one of her shoes and "cast" it as far as she could till it landed far away and out of her sight. Now that is "casting"!
- Pray for those in authority over us (I Tim 2:2) – Our prayers are especially for those who are trying to follow the way Scripture teaches us to live. For those in opposition to those teachings we can pray for

an awakening to the error and folly of their ways.

- Listen for the trumpet We are counseled in Lk 21:28 to "look up for our redemption draws nigh" when we see signs of prophesy beginning to unfold.
- Obey the Father Our ways may seem right to us but our hearts are deceitful (Jer 17:9) and we easily want to follow our own ways of what seems right to us.
- 6. Teach and hold on to the truth regarding the theory of Evolution – The 2 books in the Bible that are attacked the most are Genesis and Revelation. In Gen 3:1 the Serpent began his temptation by questioning the Word of God by saying "Hath God said?" and thereby placing doubt on God's Word. Finding Truth in the world today is difficult to say the least. ALL Truth lies in Scripture and all information and teaching needs to be compared to this standard. Accepting Darwinism Evolution has resulted in a progressive disregard for people's lives as created in God's image.
- Don't get distracted! We have a God given mission in life to walk in the WAY and share that Truth with others. We can get distracted by just trying to meet people's physical

needs and leave their souls and spirits unfed. The Social Gospel is really no gospel (good news) at all.

8. "Set no evil thing before your eyes" Psalm 101:3 – Our eyes are one of the first lines of entry to what happens in our soul and spirit. An "innocent" peek is not advisable. Evil is evil and always will be. Putting "lipstick on a pig" will not change the pig into something it never was nor will be. A current mantra of rioters is that we can use evil to accomplish the "greater good". For all eternity that will not be true. God can turn the evils aimed at us for His purpose but that is not our job nor within our power to do so.

All ages need to be reminded of this – children, teens, and adults of all ages. Golden Lifers are no different. Our fears may differ slightly from younger years but we are never far from the fear trap. Fear and reverence of and to the Lord is the only room we must make for fear.

Heavenly Father – our "Abba" – Remind us to walk in Your Way. We have forgotten or ignored You so often resulting in so many traps of the Evil One ensnaring us and compromising our witness. Please, for Jesus sake and in His Name, forgive us and empower us to walk in Your WAY. Remind us we are "dust" (Psalm 103:14) and soon our bodies will return to dust. We thank You that time after time in Your Word You remind us to fear not and follow the narrow WAY that leads to Life. Thank You Father, Jesus Christ, Holy Spirit. Amen
