Mission Trip Jessa Ter Beest

From January 3-10, 2020, our young adult group is heading on a mission trip to the Jamaica Deaf Village. This trip is organized through Caribbean Christian Centre for the Deaf and the Reformed Church of America.

The center we'll be serving at is a village and labor skills school for many of the deaf adults in Jamaica, so we'll be participating in bilingual (Jamaican Sign Language) worship and spending time with the people there learning more about their jobs, helping with some on-site projects, playing soccer, telling our stories and listening to theirs with the sign language we learned ahead of time (and through writing back and forth in notebooks), and building Christ-like

relationships that bridge the gap between America and Jamaica, and the hearing and deaf communities.

The theme for the week is "Our Story." We'll be talking about the fact that we are all a part of God's big story and how this mission trip is a part of that story. The theme centers on the idea that God has a plan for each of us and he intentionally intersects our stories with others to build His kingdom.

Golden Lifers Update By Roxy Schouten

Along with Jude 3 "I felt compelled to write to you and urge you to contend for the faith". What is that urgent and compelling message? We just passed our annual Christmas celebration and each year more and more professing Christians are denying some vital elements of the miraculous birth of our Savior Jesus Christ. Specifically I want to address the Virgin Birth. Perhaps we have delegated that as an unimportant component of that miracle. Part of that may be that some belief systems over emphasize to the point of making Mary into someone who she

was not.

A prominent pastor/author who openly denies the validity of the Virgin Birth calls it "only a symbol against patriarchy" and a "statement against bloody sacrifices of man". Another pastor/author labels the virgin birth as a "myth to give Jesus 'street cred" for His later ministry". Perhaps you have run across similar sentiments.

We may argue that this is a minor part of the belief but it is one of the first "dominoes" with each affecting and toppling our whole belief system. Those 7 "dominoes" include:

- Old Testament prophecy of a Virgin Birth and all other prophesies
- 2. Jesus Christ humanity and divinity
- 3. Jesus Christ eternity
- 4. Jesus Christ sinlessness
- Our bodily atonement our supernatural New Birth
- 6. David's lineage future earthly reign
- 7. New Testament inerrancy

Medically we can offer some explanation of the Virgin Birth necessity. In Lev 17:11 the principle of "Life is in the Blood" is laid out. We know that the blood of the unborn baby does not mingle with the mother's blood. The mother's blood transfers

nutrients to the baby but the blood does not mingle. (Note – in trauma during pregnancy or at birth injuries there may be contact with the mother's blood and that leads to issues with RH factor in the blood and must be addressed but that is another unrelated issue.) More can be explained medically but a majority we must take by faith that what the Scripture tells us is truth. That Truth is that a miracle did occur resulting in Jesus being fully man and fully God and born of a Virgin.

If Jesus was not a fully sinless human He could not be our sacrifice for sin. If Jesus was not fully God He could not have carried it out.

Don't tip over this "domino" because the resulting crash will be devastating to your faith as this "domino" tipping will affect significantly large numbers of Truth "dominos".
