ARTICLES Kinda, Sorta, Committed By Pastor Kevin Van Wyk

I'm kind of, sort of, committed to my Fidelity retirement planning. Once or twice a year, I check to see how things are going. Occasionally, I make a change to the investments. I must confess to Fidelity that Steph and I have been seeing someone else. Don't worry, we aren't pulling funds out, but Edward Jones is getting a bit more attention than you are. I'm kinda, sorta, committed.

There are a host of things I am kinda, sorta, committed to... Exercise is another. I did really well for two weeks. I used a stepper thing for 30 minutes a day, five days a week, but then I got sick and took a vacation. Work piled up quickly, and now I have no desire to exercise.

What about you? What are you kinda, sorta, committed to?

At the dedication of the temple, Solomon prays a looooong prayer (1 Kings 8:23-53). Then he stands and proclaims these words to the people... 8:56 "Praise be to the LORD, who has given rest to his people Israel just as he promised. Not one word has failed of all the good promises he gave through his servant Moses. 8:57 May the LORD our God be with us as he was with our fathers; may he never leave us nor forsake us. 8:58 May he turn our hearts to him, to walk in all his ways and to keep the commands, decrees and regulations he gave our fathers. 8:59 And may these words of mine, which I have prayed before the LORD, be near to the LORD our God day and night, that he may uphold the cause of his servant and the cause of his people Israel according to each day's need, 8:60 so that all the peoples of the earth may know that the LORD is God and that there is no other. 8:61 But your hearts must be fully committed to the LORD our God, to live by his decrees and obey his commands, as at this time." (1 Kings 8:56-61)

What a great statement of praise... God has helped us (56). Then a statement of hope... May God keep us on track and continue to help us (57-59). Then a statement of purpose... May the result be that ALL PEOPLE KNOW GOD IS LORD. Finally, a clear challenge... **God's help** and mission rests on our being fully committed to Him!

I hope you are saying, "I'm all in God! I am

yours. I'll do whatever you call me to do."

If that is you, I want to flesh that out a bit... What does it mean to be committed to following Jesus?

#1. We commit to daily prayer and Bible reading. You have God's Word readily available. Are you reading and studying his words with a humble, prayerful heart?

#2. We commit to obeying God's instructions. This includes discipling others, witnessing to the lost, gathering in worship, giving to His mission, and serving with our God-given abilities.

#3. We commit to His body, the church. Our membership vows and our leadership covenant lay out this commitment well. We commit to following Jesus with other believers, to love them, to receive correction, and to correct our fellow believers.

Have you committed to partnering with us as a member (see The Discovering Membership Packet at the information desk)? Have you committed to leading well by signing our leadership covenant (available at the information desk)? Solomon makes it clear that it's not perfection God is looking for, but a passionate commitment! So, are you kinda, sorta, committed, or fully

committed?

I urge you take the step of commitment today! Partner as a member or sign our Leadership Covenant so all people may know the Lord is God!

Golden Lifers Update By Roxy Schouten

October 31 gets overshadowed by secular observations. Even the Church has often lost sight of a significant event on this date. On this date, Martin Luther nailed the 95 thesis on a church door in Germany that was to mark a significant point in the struggle to return to the beliefs and practices of the early church. The Dark Ages began to lose its grip where lay people did not have Scripture to use as final authority on their beliefs and practices. This was a significant mark in time when the 5 "solas" were again practiced – "only Scripture", "only Faith", "only Grace", "only Jesus Christ", "only Gory of God".

I recently purchased the classic book "Foxe's Book Of Martyrs" which describes the atrocities experienced by Believers who held to and practiced those "solas". The atrocities we recently hear of committed by ISIS and other terrorist groups are an inkling of what these Believers experienced.

Golden Lifers are studying the book of Romans while being led by Pastor Ted. This book was pivotal in bringing people back to the Gospel when once they were allowed to read Scripture for themselves. A summary of the book of Romans is found in Rom 1:16-17 – "For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ; for it is the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth; to the Jew first, and also to the Greek. For therein is the righteousness of God revealed from faith to faith; as it is written, the just shall live by faith". (KJV)

So many things take us away from this powerful message. Yes, older adults struggle with accepting and living this too. Pastor Ted shared his concern as he has visited with many older adults with guilt over past sins or life styles and doubt the assurances of God's forgiveness and imputed righteousness. Romans has those assurances. Praise God!!!!

Therefore, we send a strong invitation and

urgency to all those older adults to join us as we tackle those issues. Each word, verse and page holds treasures to be discovered as we learn and share our experiences. As invited at the end of scripture in Rev. 22:17, "Come"!

Foster Care Ministry Update By Lindsey Bruins & Benita Ter Beest

Since the initial Foster Care Awareness event back in June, this ministry has been busy supporting families and growing our volunteer base. We currently have 22 trained volunteers either serving on one of two active care communities or waiting to serve once an additional foster family has a placement. Some of the ways these volunteers serve are by providing a meal once a month, assisting with transportation, acting as a child mentor, or offering interim childcare while the foster parents take some much needed time for rest and relaxation. Another way our volunteers serve is as a team leader for a specific care community. This person calls the foster family once a week to see how they are doing and to ask for any prayer requests or praises that they then share in a weekly email to their care community. It's amazing to see the way God works not only in these foster parents but the children as well. Check out this update from one of our families:

"I can't thank you all enough for the way you have supported our family through spending time with our kids, showing up, making meals, praying, checking in, etc. We are seeing leaps and bounds of progress be made! I never thought they'd hug us to now they randomly let me hug them even if it isn't bedtime! And they let my head touch their head when I hug. I can't even tell you how much that means to me. Oh, and they wanted to ride with ME this morning after church like I was the cooler one or something. Hahaha! Totally surprising because I never felt like I had that motherly instinct. Well look at me now! Not perfect by any means, but God certainly has been able to use us just because we let him and said 'yes'... and having all of you along on this journey has made such a difference! I can't imagine doing this without you all."
