Sermon Notes: Spiritual Gifts

Key Scriptures: 1 Corinthians 12:1-31

Crude Outline of 1 Corinthians up to this point.

Chpts. 1-6 Paul's greetings and addressing issues within the church he's heard about.

Chpts. 7-14 Paul's Response to issues the Corinthians had written to him about.

Chpt. 7 Marriage

Chpts. 8-14 Paul addresses issues of worship

- Eating meat sacrificed to idols.
- Giving up your rights, so you don't cause others to sin.
- Head coverings in worship.
- Gluttony and drunkenness during communion.
- Spiritual gifts.

2 Typical Views on Spiritual Gifts

- 1. Abilities God has given us here on earth for the purpose of fulfilling what He has created me for. Examples would be intelligence, athleticism, musical ability, etc...
- 2. What are often referred to as "sign" gifts. They're called sign gifts because they're what many people think of as a SIGN of something supernatural happening in the natural. Examples would be healing, prophesying (as in foretelling the future), speaking in tongues, miracles, etc...

Takeaways from what Paul is saying here about Spiritual Gifts

- 1. Spiritual gifts are given by the Spirit of God.
- <u>1 Corinthians 12:4</u> There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit distributes them.
- 2. Everyone has spiritual gifts.

- 3. The purpose of spiritual gifts are for the common good.
- <u>1 Corinthians 12:7</u> Now to each one the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good.
- 4. God determines what gifts we receive.
- <u>1 Corinthians 12:11</u> All these are the work of one and the same Spirit, and he distributes them to each one, just as he determines.
- 5. The gifts we've received are meant to help us function as the part of the Body of Christ where God has placed us.
- <u>1 Corinthians 12:18</u> But in fact God has placed the parts in the body, every one of them, just as he wanted them to be.
- 6. No one has all the gifts.
- <u>1 Corinthians 12:29-30</u> 29 Are all apostles? Are all prophets? Are all teachers? Do all work miracles? 30 Do all have gifts of healing? Do all speak in tongues? Do all interpret?
- 7. We should desire spiritual gifts.
- 1 Corinthians 12:31a Now eagerly desire the greater gifts.
- 8. Spiritual gifts without love are all in vain.

Chapter 13, we'll talk about that next week!

Application:

- 1. Pray for contentment, with who God has created you to be.
- 2. Eagerly desire, pray, and seek spiritual gifts.
- 3. Don't be afraid to try new things, you may discover gifts that God has given you that you didn't know you had!
- 4. Discover your gifts by asking those who know you the best, or take this online assessment provided by our church: www.assessme.org/8274.aspx
- 5. Be careful to not fall into the trap that "our church does it the right way".
- 6. Seek the Gift Giver more than the gifts.
