Our foundation is God's Word.





Our community is a great place to live.

Alto Reformed Church is in a rural setting located in the town of Alto, Wisconsin. We are 5 miles from Waupun (population of 11,340), a half an hour from the larger cities of Fond du Lac and Beaver Dam, and roughly an hour drive to the major cities of Madison, Milwaukee, and Appleton. The population of the town of Alto is approximately 1,103. Its primary industry comes from a cheese processing plant within its borders, and the agricultural industry employs a large percentage of area residents. The congregation is comprised of members from Alto and the surrounding communities, including Brandon, Waupun, and others. Alto is located in the Waupun Area School District. The Laconia (Brandon and Rosendale) School District is a near-by option for families. Waupun also has the Central Wisconsin Christian School and a homeschool network.

The Alto Fair gives a wonderful picture of the community's values. This small fair brings 2,000-3,000 people to our small town. It's in the middle of the week to avoid Sunday and there is no alcohol or entrance fee. The food tent is run by volunteers and the proceeds cover most of the event's expenses.
