

DISCIPLESHIP ESSENTIALS

Sermon Notes: Fruit of the Spirit Key Scriptures: 1 Corinthians 12:1-31

What are Spiritual Gifts For?

- 1. The common good of the Body. (1 Cor. 12:7)
- 2. To Equip the Saints for the work of ministry for building up the body of Christ. (Eph. 4:11-13)
- 3. To serve one another. (1 Pet. 4:10)
- 4. The glory of God. (1 Pet. 4:10-12)

How do we discover our Spiritual gifts:

- 1. Pray and ask God.
- 2. Ask others.
- 3. Take a Spiritual gifts assessment.
- 4. Try some things out.

Pitfalls of Spiritual gifts:

- 1. Lack of contentment. (1 Cor. 12:15)
- 2. Coveting other's gifts. (1 Cor. 12:16)
- 3. Pride. (1 Cor. 12:21)
- 4. Complacency (Mt. 25:14-30)

Application:

- 1. Pray and ask God what your spiritual gifts are.
- 2. Look over the spiritual gifts listed on the back of the insert and ask someone who knows you well, or that you trust to answer them for you.
- 3. Get involved. Consider serving as a Sunday School teacher, bible class teacher, youth coach, or connecting to another ministry within Body.

SPIRITUAL GIFTS

Mercy: Special ability to show sympathy to suffering saints. Meals to the sick, hospital visits, phone calls to those hurting.

Service: Special ability to joyfully serve behind the scenes. Set up chairs, ushering, assist leaders.

Hospitality: Special desire to offer home, food, and lodging. Host missionaries, Bible studies, singles to dinner.

Giving: Special desire and ability to give above and beyond a tithe. Generosity toward youth mission trips, deacon fund offerings, para-church ministries, a suit for the pastor.

Administration: Special ability to orchestrate program details. Committee work, volunteer for church office, conference supervision.

Leadership: Special ability to preside or govern wisely. Boards of Christian ministries. Visible roles, elders, deacons, committee chairperson, run nursery program, fund-raising.

Faith: Vision for new projects that need doing and perseverance to see them through. Building programs, new ministries.

Discernment: Ability to detect error. Meet with teachers who may be teaching incorrectly, letters to the editor.

Knowledge: Spiritual ability to search and acquire Scriptural truth. Academic pursuits, writing, teaching.

Wisdom: Special insight into applications of knowledge. Counseling, teaching, discussion group leader, accountability groups, friendship.

Preaching: Special ability to rightly proclaim and expound God=s truth. Preachers, lay preachers.

Teaching: Special ability to explain Scripture in edifying ways. Sunday school teachers, Bible studies, home groups, children, and youth programs.

Evangelism: Special ability to clearly present the gospel to non-believers. Sunday night church visitation program, share faith with contacts on your job, sponsor outreach events.

Apostleship: Special ability to begin new works. Missionaries, church planters, Christian service organizations

Shepherding: Unique ability to care for a flock of believers over the long haul. Pastors, elders, nursery program.

Encouragement: Special skill to inspire, encourage, and comfort. Being a friend, counseling, writing letters.

Tongues: Spiritual ability to speak in a language foreign to speaker.

Interpretation of Tongues: Spiritual ability to interpret the message of one speaking in tongues.

Miracles: Spiritual ability to actuate the supernatural intervention of God in ways beyond His ordinary working through the laws of nature.

Healing: Spiritual agency of God incurring illness and disease and restoring to health supernaturally.

NOTICE OF CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

Congregational Meeting: It is with sad, yet hopeful hearts that we seek your wisdom in discerning God's will for Alto Reformed Church regarding leaving the Reformed Church in America and joining the Alliance of Reformed Churches. This is a huge decision for our congregation and the consistory values your input, so please participate as best you can.

When: Sunday, February 28th at 9am

What information will the meeting cover? Please use the attached information (available at the Information Center) to prepare for the meeting. During the meeting Pastor Kevin and the consistory will review this information and answer questions. We will then be taking an advisory congregational vote which will be reported to the classis if the consistory approves a motion to transfer.

How can I attend? You may attend either in person or on Zoom.

How and when can I vote? Members of the Alto Reformed Church may vote either in person at the meeting or via paper or email absentee ballot beginning February 21st. Absentee ballots are available at the Information Center and may be placed in the box on the ledge of Megan's office window up until midnight on February 28th. To vote via email, please email your vote to Megan at office@altoreformedchurch.org by midnight on February 28th. Paper and email absentee votes must have the voters name written on the envelope if paper or typed if email. The results will then be tabulated and reviewed by the elders on Tuesday, March 2nd and the consistory soon after that. The ballot will request your response to two points:

- 1. I support the proposed motion to leave the RCA and join the ARC. Yes or No
- 2. What guestions or concerns do you have?

Can I ask questions/comment during the meeting if I attend via Zoom? Yes, you may do so using the chat feature and a staff member will then ask your question for you. We do ask that everyone keep their microphones muted to prevent any feedback/distractions.

Is childcare available during the meeting? We will be offering activities/childcare for the kiddos during the congregational meeting in place of Sunday School. Here is a look at where you can bring your child(ren):

- Nursery for all children up to 3.
- Sunbeamers Room for all children ages 3 through 4K.
