

APPLICATION: Take time this week to ask yourself these 4 questions to help identify if money has been an idol in your life:

- 1. Have I looked to money to satisfy me apart from God?
- 2. Have I believed that if I had more money that I would matter more?
- 3. Have I looked more often to money than God for security?
- 4. Have I looked at money in certain situations as my savior instead of God?

DAILY REFLECTION & EXERCISE

You can read over these in 1 minute, but that will not help you in this war. Instead, invite God to speak to you each day as you reflect and journal on these devotions.

DAY 1 Examine your contentment: During the sermon this week we talked about Philippians 4:13 referring to God giving us strength to be content in any situation? Ask yourself if there are areas of discontent in your life, and then pray that God will show you things you can change to move towards contentment.
DAY 2 In what ways have you looked for money to satisfy you apart from God?
DAY 3 Reflect on and journal your feelings on this question: Have I ever believed that if I had more money that I would matter more, or be more significant?

DAY 4 How have you looked to money for your security apart from God? DAY 5 Reflect on how you have looked to money to be your savior in certain situations apart from God. **DAY 6 Practice comforting others:** Bring to mind someone who is at about the same stage of life as you, but with a lot more money and success. Take some time to notice how you feel when you compare yourself to them. DAY 7 What was it like? Bring to mind someone who is at about the same stage of life as you, but with less money and success than you. Take some time to notice how you feel when you compare yourself to them.
