Family Memory Verse for March 29th: Let us examine our ways and test them, and let us return to the Lord. – Lamentations 3:40

Sermon Notes: Family - Love 'em or Hate 'em?

Key Scriptures: Luke 14:25-33

First, we have what seems like Jesus telling us that if we don't hate our family, we can't be His disciples. (Luke 14:26)

But what about Exodus 20:12 & 1 John 3:15?

Then we have the time that seems like Jesus doesn't really care about the needs of His own family any more than the needs of anyone else. (Luke 8:19-21)

But what about John 19:25-27?

As if that's not enough...next in Luke 18 it sounds like Jesus is telling us the benefits of leaving our family. (Luke 18:28-29)

But what about 1 Timothy 5:4&8?

Finally, in Luke it sounds like Jesus tells us that He came to divide families.

(Luke 12:51-53)

But what about Ephesians 5:28-29 & 6:1&4?

3 Principles that will help us to understand God's word:

- 1. God is always the priority.
- 2. Scripture never contradicts itself.
- 3. Be careful not to take scripture out of context; we must understand scripture as a whole.

Application

- 1. When making decisions, ask yourself, "Does this decision make God the priority?"
- 2. When reading scripture, and you believe you've come to a contradiction, ask the clarifying questions:
 - 1. What is the context?
 - 2. What does scripture as a whole have to say about this?
