

Sermon Notes: The Book of Nahum Key Scripture: Nahum 3:1-19

<u>1 Corinthians 15:2-3</u> - 2 By this gospel you are saved, if you hold firmly to the word I preached to you. Otherwise, you have believed in vain. 3 For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures,

<u>2 Timothy 2:1-2</u> - You then, my son, be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus. 2 And the things you have heard me say in the presence of many witnesses entrust to reliable people who will also be qualified to teach others.

Jonah 3:4-5 - 4 Jonah began by going a day's journey into the city, proclaiming, "Forty more days and Nineveh will be overthrown." 5 The Ninevites believed God. A fast was proclaimed, and all of them, from the greatest to the least, put on sackcloth.

Nahum 1:7-8 - 7 The Lord is good, a refuge in times of trouble. He cares for those who trust in him,8 but with an overwhelming flood he will make an end of Nineveh; he will pursue his foes into the realm of darkness.

Romans 11:22 - 22 Consider therefore the kindness and sternness of God: sternness to those who fell, but kindness to you, provided that you continue in his kindness. Otherwise, you also will be cut off.

Nahum 3:5 - "I am against you," declares the Lord Almighty. "I will lift your skirts over your face. I will show the nations your nakedness and the kingdoms your shame.

Nahum 3:19a - 19 Nothing can heal you; your wound is fatal.

Nahum 3:19b - All who hear the news about you clap their hands at your fall, for who has not felt your endless cruelty?

3 Big Ideas

(Job 12:23)

2. God is slow to anger, but at some point judgment will come. (2 Pet. 3:7-9)

3. Righteousness will not pass to the next generation automatically. (Judges 2:8-12)
