2. Why does God allow evil in the world?

Some people wonder why God couldn't have created humans in such a way that we would never sin, thus avoiding evil altogether. The fact is, such a scenario would mean that we were not truly human. We would not have the capacity to make choices and freely love...A FREE choice, however, leaves the possibility of a WRONG choice. As J.B. Phillips put it, "Evil is inherent in the risky gift of free will." ...God's plan had the potential for evil when he bestowed on humans the freedom of choice, but the actual origin of evil came as a result of a man who directed his will away from God and toward his own selfish desires. Norman Geisler and Jeff Amanu note, "Whereas God created the FACT of freedom, humans perform the ACTS of freedom. God made evil possible; creatures make it actual."
