GREAT RESOURCES AVAILABLE IN THE LIBRARY

"Knowing Scripture" by R.C. Sproul (2016) is a clear and concise overview of how to interpret the Bible. It is a great introduction to essentials for understanding the meaning and application of Scripture.

"Embodied: Transgender Identities, the Church, and What the Bible Has to Say" by Preston Sprinkle is an in-depth guide for Christians who want help navigating issues related to the transgender conversation. It challenges conservatives and progressives to understand what people are facing and what the Bible has to say.

"People to be Loved" is a comprehensive book on homosexuality by Preston Sprinkle. It is tremendously practical, relevant and Biblical. It will challenge you to re-evaluate your understanding and response to LGBTQ+.

"Grace//Truth" 1.0 & 2.0 includes videos (on RightNow Media) and two small books (with DVDs). They are from Preston Sprinkle and address the issues in his books "Embodied" & "People to be Loved." The videos raise tough questions about LGBTQ while the books give more answers and provide questions for discussion.

"Parent Resource Guide: Responding to the Transgender Issue" is an informative, well-documented, 60-page article helping parents navigate the cultural pressure coming from the transgender voices. There are a couple copies on in the library or you can get it here...
