

Sermon Notes: Tough Questions: Assurance of Salvation & Infant Baptism Key Scriptures: Ephesians 2:4-9, Genesis 17, & Acts 2:38-39 2 Questions:

1. How can I know I'm saved? (What gives me assurance of my salvation?)

A. Assurance comes from faith in the promises of God.

Ephesians 2:4-9 -.

Hebrews 11:1 -

B. Assurance comes from the testimony of the Holy Spirit testifying to our spirits that we are children of God.

2. Why do we baptize babies?

A. Both the old and new covenant give promises to believers and their children. (Genesis 17:7 & Acts 2:39)

B. The sign of the old covenant was circumcision and the sign of the new covenant is baptism. (Genesis 17:10-12 & Acts 2:38-39)

Although there's no specific scripture that says, "Thou Shalt Baptize Babies", those who practice infant baptism would say for thousands of years the sign of the old covenant has been applied to believers and their children through circumcision, and in the same way we apply the sign of the new covenant, which is baptism to believers and their children.
