

Sermon Notes: Being A Disciple

Key Scripture: Luke 9:23-24 & Luke 5:1-11

Two Lies we believe:

- 1. You're Okay (Complacency).
- 2. Whatever you do, it's never enough (Works).

Luke 14:25-33

"The cross is laid on every Christian. The first Christ-suffering which every man must experience is the call to abandon the attachments of this world. It is that dying of the old man which is the result of his encounter with Christ. As we embark upon discipleship we surrender ourselves to Christ in union with his death—we give over our lives to death. Who is a Disciple?

Who May/Should Participate In Communion?

"We welcome all those who are displeased with themselves because of their sins, but who nevertheless trust that their sins are pardoned and that their remaining weakness is covered by the suffering and death of Christ, and who also desire more and more to strengthen their faith and to lead a better life. Hypocrites and those who are unrepentant, however, eat and drink judgment on themselves." (Heidelberg Catechism Q&A 81; 1 Cor. 10:19-22; 11:26-32)

Paul challenges believers to participate in communion in a manner that is sincere and authentic. He writes to the church in Corinth...

"Eat the bread or drink the cup of the Lord in the right way. Don't do it in a way that isn't worthy of him. If you do, you will be guilty. You'll be guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord. Everyone should take a careful look at themselves before they eat the bread and drink from the cup." (1 Cor. 11:27-28 NIRV)

So, we welcome any who are trusting in Jesus for the forgiveness of sins to participate in the Lord's supper. If your child understands the above statement, they too are welcome to the table. As well, we want to urge those who trust Jesus to join with us in ministry as active confessing members. We are adding an 8AM Service. The consistory decided to do a 2-week experiment with an 8AM service on Oct. 4 and 11 for those who are more cautious. The 8AM Service will require masks along with physical distancing. There will be no congregational singing. A song would likely be played or sung by a soloist at the beginning and the end. The focus will be on prayer and the sermon. If possible, videos of children's messages will be played. The 9:30AM Service & 10:45AM Sunday School will not change. The 9:30AM service will be streamed on YouTube. We will do communion at both services on Oct. 4.

We are making a couple updates with Children & Families' Ministry.

Kid's Sunday School: We will be continuing to provide the Sunday School classes with snacks in their classrooms. As we feel it is wise to continue to keep classes separate at this time, SS singing will continue to be put on hold.

Preschool Sunday School: PreK SS will be split into two groups. The 4K students will be meeting up in the Red Room and the 3's will continue to meet in the Sunbeamer Room. This change will start Oct 4th. **Walk Out Worship:** WOW will be put on hold through the year and will be reevaluated in January.
