Media Delivery – Do you love visiting with others or connecting with those who can't get out much? Each week bulletins and recordings of the worship service are delivered to the members of our congregation that are in a nursing home or can't get out of the home often. These individuals can be such a joy to visit with even if it's just a few minutes out of the day. Media delivery is a commitment of approximately twice every 6 months. Shepherd of Care – Do you have a gift and desire to serve the hurting, the sick, and the shut-ins of Alto Reformed Church. Our church has an amazing history of providing care for one another in our times of need, and you can be a part of continuing to be the hands and feet of Jesus in this way. Each shepherd is assigned to a district of the members of the congregation that they are responsible to care for. The commitment is to visit shut-ins in your district once a month (each shepherd has a maximum of 2 shut-ins in their district), to provide care for individuals and families in your district when they are sick or hurting, and to communicate with the staff of the church to report on your visitations. Stork – Do you love that new baby smell and squishiness? Do you have a heart for supporting new moms and dads? Members of the stork committee visit parents and newborn babies and provide them with a baked treat. Contact Jane Chené to sign-up or for more details.

Welcomed – Do you love kids? Have you considered foster care, but don't feel like it's the right timing or fit right now? There are some great ways for you to help foster kids and their foster families. If any of the options below interest you or for more details, contact Benita Ter Beest.

- **Family Helpers**: Supply one meal a month, and possibly help with housework, laundry, or yard work.
- Child Mentors: Provide childcare at least twice per month.
- **Team Leaders**: Coordinate the tasks of the care community for a foster family and send weekly group emails to the team.
- **Interim Caregivers**: Serve as overnight caregivers in your home or in the foster home for one night or several nights.



Bible Class Teachers – Do you enjoy making connections with the kids of our church and community? Join our fun-filled Wednesday night classes where we use hands-on curriculum to engage the kids and help them to grow closer to Jesus all at the same time.
